Chair's Report

As a result of several factors, including the resignation of one of the Del Mar City Council representatives on the JPA Board due to illness, the JPA has not been able to establish a quorum. This affects various aspects of the River Park's everyday operations and future development proposals. The last JPA meeting had to be cancelled due to the lack of a quorum.

Executive Director's Report

The 32nd Annual Holiday Dog-friendly 5K & 3K Fun Run/Walk will be held on Saturday, December 14, 2024 on the beach in Del Mar. The Red Nose Run, which began in 1992, is a volunteer-organized activity that raises funds for various organizations. Public Comments

A resident representative provided a proposed resolution for the CAC's consideration related to the increasing the water level in Lake Hodges. The proposed draft resolution states that the water level in Lake Hodges is currently being maintained at 280 feet or less above sea level. The resolution requests that the level be raised to 293 feet above sea level to cover hundreds of areas of flammable vegetation that currently exists within the lake's footprint. The raised water level would also benefit aquatic and terrestrial wildlife and allow reconnection to the Olivenhain Reservoir. The risk of dam failure has been described as <0.1%, but the resolution states that the risk of wild fire under current conditions is much greater. The authors of the resolution urge the JPA and all relevant authorities and stakeholders to take the necessary steps to undertake further environmental and economic study to ensure the safety, health, and wellbeing of the surrounding communities.

The resolution could not be considered at the meeting because it was not included on the agenda. It will likely be revised at a future meeting.
