

**Miramar CLF Report
June 19 2008**

The report for this June meeting is somewhat abbreviated due to the fact that I was unable to attend. However, the Community Plans and Liaison office was kind enough to forward some pertinent information from that meeting. The following may be of interest:

The guest speaker for this meeting was Liz Barnes who is Miramar's School Liaison Officer. We who have lived here for a long time need to remember that because of military orders, our military families are frequently moved around the country to various duty stations. In addition, one or both parents may be deployed to the combat zone.

Miramar families have 2321 school aged dependents. They attend 42 school districts in San Diego County and 23 districts in Riverside County. 1258 students from Miramar families attend the San Diego Unified School District.

Typical concerns of Miramar parents include credit transfers from other schools, learning assessments, transportation, and before/after school care that is both affordable and accessible.

The school sites are often concerned about truancy, behavioral evaluating and intervention if necessary and, like the parents; they are concerned over adequate before and after school supervision and care.

The air operations summary for the base during the month of May is as follows: Total air operations for May 2008 were 5,371, which is down from the same month last year when the base supported 6,395 air operations. In April, the base received 19 noise complaints, while the base received 30 complaints during the month of May. Of those 30 complaints, 11 were from frequent callers. The I-15 helicopter route registered one noise complaint, while the Julian North Jet Departure route registered 3 noise complaints. These are the two routes that impact Rancho Bernardo. None of the noise complaints received were from Rancho Bernardo.
