**Declaration of Candidacy Application for Rancho Bernardo
Community Planning Board Election--2018**

WHO IS ELIGIBLE: Candidates must be a resident of Rancho Bernardo, at least 18 years of age, and shall also be affiliated with the community as a: (1) Property owner, who is an individual identified as the sole or partial owner of record, or their designee, of a real property (either developed or undeveloped), within the community planning area. A property owner need not reside in the community to be an eligible candidate, or (2) Resident whose primary address of residence is located in the Rancho Bernardo community planning area but who does not necessarily own the property in which he or she lives, or (3) Local business person who is a local business owner, operator, or designee of a non-residential real property address in the Rancho Bernardo community planning area. **Only one representative of a particular establishment may hold a seat on the Planning Board at one time.** In order to be a candidate in the March election, an eligible member of the community must have documented attendance at one entire meeting of the Rancho Bernardo Community Planning Board's last 12 meetings prior to the February regular meeting preceding the election.

AREA REPRESENTED: Community Planning Board members are elected by the specific district in which they reside. (See Descriptions of Districts on following page.)

STEPS TO APPLY: Candidates must fully complete this Declaration of Candidacy Application and submit it to the Election Committee, per the instructions below. The Candidate's name will appear on the ballot as you print below, and in an order on the ballot to be determined by a drawn lot. If a picture of the candidate is attached, candidate agrees that the picture may be published in the local newspaper, newsletter or other election materials. A copy of this form, in its entirety, will be given to the Rancho Bernardo News Journal for election coverage purposes. **Contact information will not be published in the paper.**

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Basic Election Rules:

Candidates must be a resident of Rancho Bernardo, at least 18 years of age, and shall also be affiliated with the community as a: (1) Property owner, who is an individual identified as the sole or partial owner of record, or their designee, of a real property (either developed or undeveloped), within the community planning area. A property owner need not reside in the community to be an eligible candidate, or (2) Resident whose primary address of residence is located in the Rancho Bernardo community planning area but who does not necessarily own the property in which he or she lives, or (3) Local business person who is a local business owner, operator, or designee of a non-residential real property address in the Rancho Bernardo community planning area. **Only one representative of a particular establishment may hold a seat on the Planning Board at one time.**

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The elected representative must attend monthly board meetings which take place on the 3rd Thursday at 7 pm. Non-attendance at three (3) consecutive meetings or four (4) total meetings annually will result in disqualification. Members are elected to 2-year terms.

The elected representatives are expected to actively participate in at least one of Rancho Bernardo Community Planning Board's committees.

Planning Board members are elected by the district in which they live. We encourage friendly campaigning, such as informing friends and neighbors, introducing self through newsletters or flyers, etc. Whatever approach you choose, please remember that this is a friendly and courteous procedure.

It is illegal to solicit votes through un-mailed materials in U.S. mailboxes and that electioneering at or near the polls during the election process and on Election Day is prohibited and will result in disqualification. Under state law, "electioneering" means any kind of campaigning whatsoever within 100 feet of the voting places.

Ballots will be counted prior to the regularly scheduled March 15, 2018 meeting and announced during the meeting. Newly elected members will be seated at the April 19, 2018 regular board meeting.
